2008 Tennessee Junior Livestock Exposition was 37th Consecutive

The 2008 Tennessee Junior Livestock Exposition was the 37th annual one. Four hundred fifty-eight (458) 4-H and FFA members from 66 Tennessee counties exhibited 1440 cattle and sheep in Junior Beef and Sheep events.

Junior exhibitors competed in 124 different events. This included the exhibition of Cattle, Market Steer Roundup, Top Ten Carcass, Sheep, as well as competition in Showmanship, Premier Exhibitor and Skillathon in both cattle and sheep areas. In addition, a public speaking and wool show were available for the sheep exhibitors.

The beef events were held at the Tennessee Livestock Center, in Murfreesboro, July 7-9 and the sheep events were conducted at Hyder-Burks Pavilion at Cookeville, July 14-17.
