On-Line Interactive Webcast

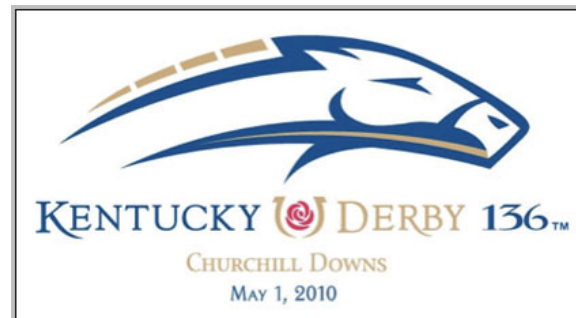
