POSITION ANNOUNCEMENT

Faculty Position in Dairy Research & Extension

Qualifications: Earned doctoral degree in one of the recognized disciplines in Animal or Dairy Science or a closely related field and significant experience with US dairy management systems. Demonstrated research ability, effective oral and written communication skills, and evidence of strong potential for successful establishment of an extramurally-funded research and Extension program are essential. Postdoctoral experience in an appropriate discipline is preferred.

Responsibilities and Expectations:

- 12-month, tenure-track position with 70% Research and 30% Extension responsibilities
- Establish an independent Research program (basic and/or applied) benefiting the Tennessee and US dairy industries
- Develop an extramurally-funded Research/Extension program (grants, contracts, gifts, and/or fee-based programs)
- Create scholarly, peer-reviewed scientific journal papers and Extension publications
- Mentor MS and PhD students
- Provide training and research-based information to county Extension Agents and other Extension Specialists towards their programmatic efforts
- Assist in implementation of statewide 4-H Youth Development programs
- Establish and maintain a strong working relationship with organizations and industries serving the dairy industry
- Participate in other activities of the Department of Animal Science and Institute of Agriculture, such as committee service and student recruitment

Excellent opportunities exist for interdisciplinary and collaborative research with scientists from several disciplines. Two dairy research herds are currently available with associated production trait data, and construction of a new research dairy near Knoxville is underway and is expected to be complete by December 2010. This new dairy facility will provide unique opportunities for collaborative interdisciplinary research on environmental issues impacting the dairy industry. Several core research facilities are also available. The University of Tennessee at Knoxville has an enrollment of more than 26,000 students and is located near the Smoky Mountains with abundant opportunities for outdoor recreation. The Department of Animal Science has 28 faculty members and offers bachelor's degrees in Animal Science with concentrations in Animal Industries, BioSciences and Pre-Veterinary Medicine.
